- g) Serve as the liaison officer between the SA Executive Branch and the University Office of Public Relations in matters of mutual concern.
- h) Oversee and coordinate all public relations activities for SA.
- i) Collaborate with other officers to provide creative direction for the visual presentation of their events.
- j) Actively participate in and support all SA functions."

  - 2) Support existing prayer groups, encourages students to start new ones, and oversees a prayer hour in crowded places like the promenade to offer prayer to whoever is passing by and invite them to participate in the other ministries on campus.
  - 3) Organize Sundown Worship events that include worship, Scripture study, and activities to foster community.
  - 4) Organizes the fall semester's SA Spiritual Event (such as SA Vespers).
  - 5) Plan and execute one outreach activity during the winter semester to serve the broader student body or local community.
  - 6) Mentor other students, encouraging their growth in faith and leadership.
  - 7) Identify and train potential student leaders for future spiritual leadership roles.
  - 8) Actively participate in and support all SA functions."

  - a. "The duties of the SA Senate Appropriations Committee shall be to:
    - i. Research worthwhile projects for the SA Senate to sponsor.
    - ii. Allow project committee to endorse a specific project based on its merit.
    - iii. Review proposals prior to presentation at SA Senate.
    - iv. Support the Scholarship in the pursuit of funding and contacts.
    - v. Ensure that the financial goals of the Scholarship fund are met..
    - vi. Provide support for the Student Association Scholarship Board.
    - vii. Be responsible for appropriations to clubs."

#### a. Cultural Liaison

- i. Proposal to terminate Cultural Liaison position and spread out responsibilities to other SA officers
- ii. Discussion/Questions
  - 1. Important to keep position because SA may need it in the future
    - a. It's important to have a cultural connection
    - b. More potential/power can be given to position
    - c. International students appreciate what the Cultural Liaison does
      - i. Could work with the international department
    - d. Could use fund for Cultural Club leaders
    - e. As a diverse university we should keep this position

- 2. Last year's Senate already discussed and has come back to the same place
- 3. Do you think the problem is the person because they are not qualified
  - a. All students were qualified
- 4. What would happen if Alexis is not there
  - a. It would go through the hierarchy
- 5. Position was added 5 years ago
- 6. The position became an experiment, and it has been determined that this position was not a significant contribution to the clubs over the past 3 years
- 7. Still Senate persisted to keep this position as of last year
- 8. After a year of the cultural liaison being more actively involved, it still has not delivered a significant contribution
